Dear Paw Creek,

Update from Session on Transitional Pastor Search

The Worship Committee has secured Supply Pastors for the months of February and March. The Rev. Betsy Williamson will be with us on February 2nd and 9th and March 2. The Rev. Fred Grosse will be with us on February 16th and 23rd and March 16th, 23rd and 30th. March 9th is Scout Sunday so we will not have a Supply Pastor that day.

Our next step is to hire a Transitional Pastor who will be with us for at least a year as we work together to discern where God is leading us and what qualifications we would look for in a permanent pastor. Please remember that the Session has full responsibility to elect a search committee and to hire a Transitional Pastor.

The following is where we stand and the work that has been and is being done to begin our search for a Transitional Pastor. The Session met on December 8, 2024, and approved the following: a job description for the Transitional Pastor, gave the Search Committee permission to offer compensation to the Transitional Pastor up to the amount of pastoral compensation on the 2024 budget and elected Wesley Johnston, Danny McClure and Debbie Taylor to be the Transitional Pastor Search Committee.

The Session completed their Exit Interview on December 30th with our General Presbyter, Jan Edmiston, as Moderator. The Job Description has already been sent to the Committee on Ministry and hopefully by the time you read this the financial information will have been sent to the Committee on Ministry and the Presbytery Comptroller so we can be approved by the Committee on Ministry to begin to interview Transitional pastors. This process seems to be much less burdensome than the last time we hired a Transitional (then called an Interim) Pastor. I am hopeful that we will have a Transitional Pastor shortly after the end of March.

The Church Session held its first Stated Meeting of 2025 on January 13. New elders Peggy Harrington, Wesley Johnson, Danny McClure and Teresa Smith were ordained/installed on January 12 and were present for the Stated Meeting.

Session organized its work for 2025. Session also updated representatives to work with our Truist Bank accounts, authorized dates for celebration of the Lord's Supper during the year, set the Annual Meeting of the Congregation for March 30, and set the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm as the date for regular meetings in March, May, July, September and November

In additional actions, Session approved minutes of past meeting and received Financial Statements for October and November (the December year-end statement is in process); directed the Finance Committee to seek guidance from the Comptroller of the Presbytery and recommend further action to schedule an annual Financial Review; reviewed and clarified the official church membership roll in preparation for the 2024 Statistical Report to the denomination; and reviewed Presbytery's "Covenant of Closure" for former pastors (information will be provided orally and in writing to the Congregation prior to the end of January - see elsewhere in this newsletter.) The Outreach Committee was authorized to seek donations to support Presbyterian Disaster Assistance as the need arises prior to the March Stated Meeting.

Paw Creek Commissioners to meetings of the Presbytery of Charlotte will be: Amy McGee and Ken Scott, February 8 at First Church; and Wesley Johnston and Debbie Taylor, May 20 here at Paw Creek in partnership with Woodland Church.

The next Stated Meeting of Session will be Sunday, March 16 at 12:30 pm.

A Final Note From the Pastor....

Dear Paw Creek,

As I write this, we still have before us a worship service, a meal together and a few miscellaneous other gatherings between now and January 31. By the time those are behind us, all will have been said. And yet none of us will have found words to say everything.
